

CCHS Athletic Hall of Fame



This year Carbondale Community High School introduced the Athletic Hall of Fame. The Athletic Hall of Fame has been in the works for a few years, and this fall all the plans finally came together.

A committee of nine members selects graduates of CCHS through nominations made by other people. The CCHS Athletic Hall of Fame is intended

to honor those persons who have greatly contributed to the success and history of Terrier Athletics. Living or deceased alumni, former coaches, and longtime supporters of the athletic program at CCHS are eligible. Alumni are eligible 10 years after graduation from CCHS. Entire teams are eligible to be inducted en masse into the Hall of Fame. The number of selections for the Hall of Fame each year is at the discretion of the selection committee.

The first round of inductees had twenty participants, eleven of whom have played sports on a professional level. Many of the inductees were past athletes, some were coaches, and one special couple was acknowledged for their loyalty to being fans of Carbondale sports for many decades.

Future inductions for the Athletic Hall of Fame are scheduled to happen every two years coinciding with the home Murphysboro football game, kicking off the football season. During the boys basketball home games, the Athletic Hall of Fame hallway will be open for viewing, along with a video being displayed recapping the induction ceremony for fans and spectators to watch during half-time. Athletic Director Rick Moss is very pleased with the outcome of the Athletic Hall of Fame and said that it will “be a great tradition here at Carbondale.”


CCHS Athletic Hall of Fame Inductee Chris Brewer

Chris Brewer, class of 1980, was an all-around athlete. She played volleyball, basketball, and softball for CCHS. Brewer was part of the first All-South basketball and softball teams for Carbondale Community High School. 1978 was a great year for Brewer. She was on the 1978 volleyball team which took third place in state, and she set a state record with fourteen consecutive serves for volleyball that year. Looking back at this achievement, Brewer stated, "It was such a fun memory and then driving back to Carbondale knowing there was going to be a parade in our honor it was a truly a memory."

Brewer also received the underclassmen

Athlete of the Year Award and the Frank Bleyer Outstanding Senior Class Female Player Award during her reign at CCHS. She then went on to play softball, on scholarship, for Southern Illinois University in Carbondale. Being inducted into the hall of fame was a great honor for Brewer. Though she does know, "You're only as good as the people that surround you."

CCHS Athletic Hall of Fame Inductee Ron Acks

What Ron Acks really wanted everyone to take away from his success is that Carbondale was a great place for him to grow up, and it made him into the individual he is today. Acks graduated from Carbondale Community High School in 1962. He was a three sport athlete, but his main focus was football. This showed in his many high school achievements, including two first team All-Conference and two first team All-South. He had a 17-1 record as a starting quarterback and received a first team All-State commendation. After signing with the University of Illinois he switched posi-

tions from quarterback to safety and helped his team win the 1964 Rose Bowl against the Washington Huskies.

After a stellar college career Acks had to choose between the National Football League (NFL) and the American Football League (AFL). To avoid a bidding war between the two leagues, Acks and four other teammates from the University of Illinois were recruited by the NFL to attend the 1966 draft. Acks was selected in the fourth round by the Minnesota Vikings. After playing for a decade in the NFL, Acks officially retired and currently resides in North Carolina. Carbondale Community High School officially retired his jersey number of 19 in 1961. Acks will still show off his Terrier Pride by occasionally attending the Carbondale versus Murphysboro game.

CCHS Athletic Hall of Fame Inductee Craig Bardo

Craig Bardo was inducted into the Carbondale Community High School Athletic Hall Of Fame for his outstanding representation of the school through athletics. Bardo stated, "I wasn't naturally agile or athletic, but what I accomplished with the help and support of family, coaches, teammates, and friends was the result of many unseen hours of struggle, heartache, and overcoming self-doubt." Alongside running track, he was the 1980's basketball star for the Carbondale Terriers. He was also accepted to the Associated Press All-State.

Bardo played in the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association (IBCA) All-Star game as well as making it to IBCA All-State. After graduating high school, Bardo was given one of only two full-ride scholarships that were given every year by Indiana University to play basketball for Coach Bobby Knight. After one academic year at Indiana University, Bardo decided to transfer to Bradley but shortly thereafter enrolled in the Navy. He was contacted by The Citadel, The Military College of South Carolina during his time in the Navy learning he had eligibility remaining.

After just over two years in the Navy, he was allowed to accept a scholarship to attend The Citadel. He graduated from there in 1987 with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration.

Currently, Bardo resides in Nashville, Tennessee with his wife and five children. He works for BroadRiver Asset Management located in New York in the Empire State Building as the director of marketing, sales and investor relations.

Even with the regional challenge of balancing work and family, Bardo believes "an appropriate balance is crucial to being successful in either."
